Dene Adventures' camp to share Dene culture, art and foods. Listen to the beat of the traditional drums and join the excitement of traditional Dene Hand Games.

Canadian Arctic Signature Package

4 days – March from Yellowknife

Learn and experience the Northern way of life while surrounding yourself in the stark beauty of the Arctic tundra. Visit a herd of 3000 reindeer and Tuktoyaktuk on the Arctic Ocean.

Arctic Coast Adventure Package

4 days – August from Inuvik

Experience the rich history and culture of the Beaufort Delta and the arctic coast by boat! Your voyage will take you from Inuvik to Herschel Island where you will set up camp just like the Inuvialuit whalers did over 100 years ago.

True Northwest Territories Experiences with Narwal Northern Adventures

Narwal Northern Adventures specializes in cultural tours in the Northwest Territories. Tours leave from NARWAL's own Bed and Breakfast, overlooking picturesque Great Slave Lake which provides easy lake access for skiing and paddling. The Yellowknife Airport is a 15-minute drive away, and the city centre of Yellowknife can be reached within a 5-minute drive. Historic old town shops, including the float plane docks and the famous Bullocks Bistro are a 5-minute walk away. The aurora borealis can be viewed from the property.

Narwal Northern Adventure offers some of the following cultural packages for visitors to enjoy:

Iglu Building

In this hands-on workshop, students learn how iglu blocks are cut and how iglus are constructed. Students will also learn how a traditional Inuit iglu was arranged on the inside. Students will work in small groups to create their very own iglu village.

Aurora by Voyageur Canoe

August – September

Travel by 29-foot voyageur canoe up Yellowknife River to view the Aurora. A traditional meal of soup, bannock and beverages are provided. Experience aurora above and aurora below, once called an "aurora sandwich" by one of our guests.

Dogsledding and Birdwatching in the North with Wapusk Adventures

Wapusk Adventures offers dogsledding and birdwatching in a northern wilderness setting. Their dogsled tours feature custom-built sleds pulled by the friendliest, hardest-working huskies in Churchill. For their 2 1/2 -hour birdwatching experience, guests will travel up the beautiful Churchill River in the "River Dog" an 18-foot Transport Canada-approved jet boat. This tour is your best bet to find the rare Ross's Gull and you may also see Little Gulls, Sabine's Gulls, Bald Eagles, Osprey, Golden Eagles, and Tundra Swans, plus other birds of interest.

Immersed in Inuit Culture at Torngat Mountains National Park

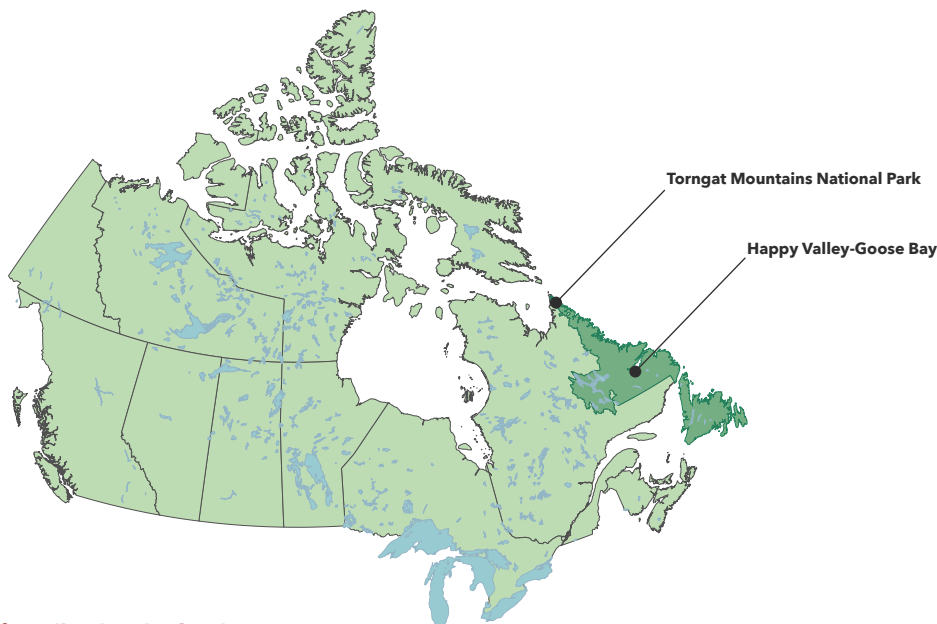

Arctic Light and Life in Arctic Bay

Visit a destination that few people get to explore. With Arctic Bay Adventures, you'll experience the Arctic Bloom Package in July, offering a profusion of wildflowers as the arctic plants look to set seed quickly in this all too brief summer. The Life on the Floe Edge Package invites visitors to travel by traditional qamutiq sleds to the edge of the Arctic Ocean sea ice in search of narwhal, the unicorn of the sea. Keep a watch out for nanook, the great white polar bear. Sample mukuk and other Inuit delicacies. Enjoy a cup of tea made from the chips of an iceberg and take part in cultural traditions dating back thousands of years.
